

Our aim at Sir John Lillie Primary is to create and maintain an environment in which children are able to develop academically, socially, emotionally and personally and succeed on the journey of lifelong learning.

This agreement aims to set out general principles regarding the duties and responsibilities of the school, the parents and the children.

As a school we will . .

- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum including taking children on trips and inviting appropriate visitors into school.
- Ensure equal opportunities for all.
- Encourage children to do their best at all times and to achieve their full potential.
- Encourage high standards of behaviour and discipline in order to maintain a safe and orderly school community.
- Contact parents about any concerns or problems that affect their child's work or behaviour.
- Provide information to parents on their child's achievement and progress both socially and academically.
- Provide homework to support schoolbased learning.
- Offer a range of before and after school activities including holiday Playcentre.
- Promote a healthy life style through our curriculum and nutritious school lunches.
- Contact parents if there is a problem with attendance or punctuality.
- Keep parents informed about school activities and general school matters through regular letters home, newsletters, website, texts, phone calls, Twitter and notices about special events.

As a parent/carer I will . . .

- Work with the school to ensure that my child reaches his/her potential academically and socially.
- Support and follow the school's policies and guidelines for behaviour, for both adults and children.
- Follow the school's high expectations with regards to attendance, punctuality and uniform. My commitment to attendance ensures my child succeeds.
- Ensure my child is in school every day of the school year.
- Notify the school promptly when my child is absent.
- Provide evidence of appointments and medical evidence when requested.
- Contact the school to discuss any matters that might affect my child's progress, health, happiness or behaviour.
- Support my child in homework and other opportunities for home learning.
- Attend parent's consultations and discussions with school staff and occasionally other professionals about my child's progress and attainment.
- Get to know about my child's life at school through newsletters and other methods of communication.
- Update the school of any changes to my contact details (address, telephone, email) and reply to letters from the school when requested.
