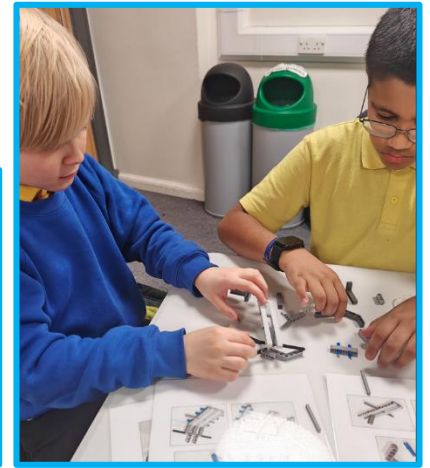

Year 5T attended a robotics workshop at Imperial College on Wednesday.



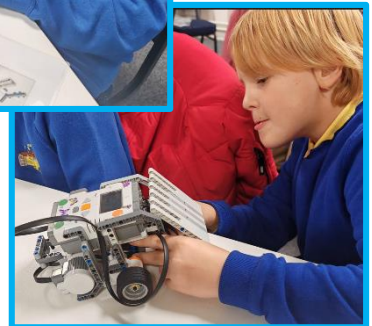
The children worked together to build their own LEGO robots, then learnt how to code them using LEGO Mindstorms NXT software.



Coding is writing a set of instructions for a computer to enable the robot to move and to sense colours on a page.



The children were taught programming basics, such as getting their robots to move in a straight line, or to turn left and right.



They were then given more difficult tasks, such as manoeuvring around a track and building a robot that performed a specific objective, such as stopping on a colour.

Children under 18 go free.

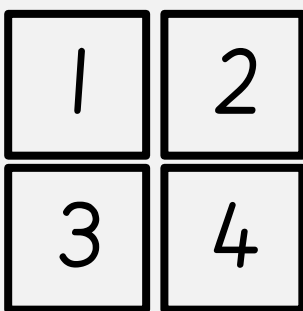
