Private fostering information h&f Are you looking after someone else's child?

What is private fostering?

If you are looking after someone else's child aged under 16 (under 18, if disabled) full-time for 28 days or more, and you are not the step-parent, grandparent, aunt, uncle, brother or sister of that child, then you may be a private foster carer.

What do I have to do if I am privately fostering or my child is privately fostered?

Call the relevant local authority preferably at least six weeks before the placement begins.

Why are Children's Services involved?

To help us keep children safe and support families who are looking after privately fostered children.

All parents and Private foster carers must notify the Local Council of a private fostering arrangement.

Please remember: if you are involved in a private fostering arrangement and you don't notify us, you are committing an offence and could risk a fine.

What if I already privately foster but did not know that I had to tell Children's Services?

Please contact Children's Services immediately, you will not get into trouble and this will not be viewed negatively. Staff will be pleased to take your details and explain the first stage of the assessment process.

How to play

- 1 Create your Beat the Street account on our website at beatthestreet.mtf or by downloading our Beat the Street App via Google Play or the App Store. Set up a team or join an existing one.
- 2 Add family members, and register a card to player profiles.
- 3 Start your journey. Find your nearest Beat Box using a paper or digital map and hover your card at the contactless Beat Box until it beeps and flashes. If playing with the app, tap the Beat Box icon on your phone and swipe to collect points.
- 4 Visit 2 Beat Boxes within an hour and collect 10 points for each Beat Box - this is 20 points for the journey.
- 5 Carry on your journey. Score 10 points for each extra Box you visit.

By playing with the Beat the Street App you can get access to exclusive featured Collect Games, choose an avatar to represent you and enter the competition with our team leaderboards. There is so much to discover!
