
Year 5 become scientists for the morning





Are you looking after someone else's child?



If you are looking after someone else's child aged under 16 (under 18, if disabled) full-time for 28 days or more, and you are not the stepparent, grandparent, aunt, uncle, brother or sister of that child, then you may be a private

>> What do I have to do if I am privately fostering or my child is privately fostered?

Call the relevant local authority preferably at least six weeks before the placement begins.



To help us keep children safe and support families who are looking after privately fostered children.

All parents and Private foster carers must notify the Local Council of a private fostering arrangement.

Please remember: if you are involved in a private fostering arrangement and you don't notify us, you are committing an offence and could risk a fine.
